WHEREAS: Council Resolution 11-730-91 established a "Historic District Study Committee" under the terms of Act No. 169, PA of 1970, as amended, for the "purpose of reviewing the desirability of establishing a historic district for the Springwells Park area" which would permit preservation of the basic architectural-exterior appearance for historical reasons by requiring a special permit "before construction, alteration, repair, moving or demolition affecting the exterior appearance" of any Springwells Park home, and

WHEREAS: It has been determined that the "Springwells Park area" is that area bounded on the north by Conrail, on the east by Greenfield Road, on the south by Rotunda Drive, and on the west by Eastham, Longmeadow and the west line of Springwells Park Subdivision No. 4, and

WHEREAS: The "Historical District Study Committee" completed its review and, pursuant to Act No. 169, PA of 1970, filed a detailed report outlining the highlights of the areas' historical significance with the City Plan Commission, and

WHEREAS: At a regular meeting of the City Plan Commission held on Monday, October 12, 1992, the Commission voted to approve the request of the "Historical District Committee" to establish a Historical District for the Springwells Park area, and forwarded its recommendation to the City Council; be it

RESOLVED: That the City Council adopts the recommendation of the City Plan Commission and hereby designates the Springwells Park area, the area bounded on the north by Conrail, on the east by Greenfield Road, on the south by Rotunda Drive, and on the west by Eastham, Longmeadow and the west line of Springwells Park Subdivision No. 4, as a Historical District.

The resolution was unanimously adopted.
